Buyers warned of changes to CPV codes

BUYERS ARE advised to be aware of upcoming changes to the way in which contract notices are submitted to the Official Journal of the European Union (OJEU).

The mandatory Common Procurement Vocabulary (CPV) codes used to classify contracts are due to change in December 2007, with the amended codes currently expected to come into force September 2008. NPS will keep readers up to date with any changes. The number of supplementary codes will rise from 400 to over 1000 and the complete, amended list will be available from January 2008.

In addition, the Nomenclature of Territorial Units for Statistics (NUTS) codes, used to break down regions into statistical groups, will be replaced in January 2008. Written notification of the new NUTS codes, which last changed in 2006, will be sent to each Member State.

Buyers are advised to be fully prepared for these imminent changes by signing up to BiP Solutions' **Project** e-notice service.

An official eSender to the OJEU, Project allows buyers to create, manage and store notices in a comprehensive database. The service is automatically updated to ensure all notices comply with national and EC regulations as well as best practice guidance.

It is now even easier to sign up to Project, which is part of BiP's **Delta** e-tendering suite, as BiP is currently offering a free Project licence to new users and a free additional licence to those who have already signed up to the service.

BiP is largest private sector eSender

ACCORDING TO the latest figures released by the Official Publications Office of the European Union (OPOCE), BiP Solutions is the largest private sector eSender of notices to the Official Journal of the European Union (OJEU).

In 2007 BiP sent more notices to the OJEU than any other eSender in the UK and, in terms of European-wide submissions, came behind only the French and Romanian governments.

BiP expects to have published 300,000 notices by the end of 2007 and is maintaining its position at the forefront of a highly competitive market – in 2007, 11 new eSenders joined the sector, four of which were from the UK and Ireland.

To celebrate this remarkable achievement, BiP is currently offering a **free licence to new**

users of its contract notification service, Project, for a limited period and will be providing existing users with a free additional licence.

The Project service – part of the **Delta** e-tendering suite – enables public bodies to send their notices to the OJEU electronically, via an XML gateway. A key advantage of this is that notices sent via a recognised XML gateway can be validated and published by the OJEU within two to three working days, so reducing the timescales for a tendering exercise.

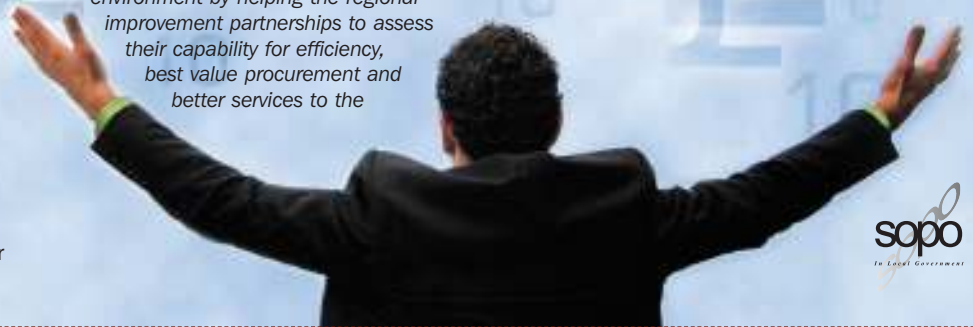

BUILDING ON projects delivered for the European Defence Agency, the United Arab Emirates Army Purchasing Directorate and the new Government Procurement Agency in Portugal – Agência

Nacional de Compras Públicas (ANCP) – BiP Solutions has been steadily increasing its global presence throughout 2007.

In March 2007, BiP was awarded a contract in partnership with local Kenyan business consultancy SPA Infosud East Africa (SPA) to provide procurement monitoring agent services to the Ministry of Education (MOE) in Kenya.

Improvement of the MOE's procurement processes is pivotal to the success of the Kenya Education Sector Support Programme which unites the Government of Kenya, development partners, civil society, communities and the private sector in an effort to deliver fairer, more effective and better quality education in the country.

The project, which BiP is delivering, commenced in April 2007. It has covered procurement from July 2006 to June 2007 and has involved delivering an independent opinion on the degree of compliance with applicable procedures and adherence to principles such as transparency, fair competition and accountability.

BiP's **Procurement Advice and Support Service (PASS)**

team was also tasked with recommending remedial measures against weaknesses in institutional arrangements and/or irregularities in procurement practices.

The BiP team visited Kenya again in late November 2007 to present the final report and recommendations to the MOE and a delegation from the World Bank, in its capacity as donor of development funding to the MOE.

Building on this successful project and partnership development, the BiP team is currently working on a number of exciting new procurement opportunities in Kenya and Tanzania.
